Vodka

<u>Vodka</u> is composed solely of <u>water</u> and ethyl alcohol with possible traces of impurities and flavorings. <u>Vodka</u> is made from a fermented substance of either grain, rye, wheat, potatoes, or sugar beet molasses. <u>Vodka</u>'s alcoholic content usually ranges between 35 - 50 per cent by volume; the standard Russian, Lithuanian and Polish vodkasare 40 per cent by alcohol volume (80proof). Historically, this alcoholic - proof standards derives from the Russian <u>vodka</u> quality standards established by the Tsar Alexander III in 1894. The Muscovite <u>Vodka</u> Museum reports that chemist Dimitri Mendeleev determined the ideal alcohol content as 38 per cent; however because in that time distilled spirits were taxed per their alcoholic strength, that percentage was rounded upwards to 40 per cent for simplified taxation calculations.
